### Class Policy for 2022 Spring Semester

Under the circumstances surrounding COVID-19, our university has been giving priority to the health and safety of students, and has been giving face-to-face lectures while taking infection prevention measures. We also have been utilizing distance-learning lectures based on the policy of each school.

We will continue to conduct face-to-face lectures while utilizing distance-learning lectures in 2022 spring semester. However, depending on the future infection situation, the class policy may be changed. In that case, we will promptly inform everyone through the Student Portal and the university website.

We have been asking for your cooperation to prevent infections through the “Notice from the President” and “Student Action Guidelines for Preventing COVID-19 Infection.” It has been reported that the Omicron variant of the coronavirus is more contagious than the conventional one, so each of you needs to be more careful than ever. In order to help students feel as much at ease as possible, we will continue to implement infection prevention measures based on the opinions of infection control experts, and make every effort to ensure your learning. We ask for your understanding and cooperation.

#### 【Class Policy for Spring Semester, 2022】

- Basically Face-to-Face for both General Education and Specialized Education
- Classes which have a large number of students may be offered online (On-demand, in combination with face-to-face is desirable). For details of the class schedule, please check the class timetable which will be released at the end of March.

We will continue to implement the infection prevention measures as below;

- Securing social distance with the number of students set/ as the exam capacity (sitting in every other seat)
- Distributing hand sanitizer to every lecture room and providing appropriate ventilation

- Setting acrylic partitions on instructors' desks
  - Setting acrylic partitions on students' desks in some lecture rooms
  - Congestion reducing measures by the cafeteria and Co-op shop on Bunkyo campus
- \*Avoiding crowded spaces by extending lunch break by 30 minutes (12:00-13:30)
